Information about the CD:

Stories and Songs from My Country - by Marge Jackson -

Marge was born in 1918 in Haines Junction, Yukon Canada where she lives today. She is an elder in the Champagne and Aishihik First Nations and a speaker of Southern Tutchone or Dänk'e. Her name in Dänk'e is Chùschwa or Water Feathers and she is part of the Wolf clan.

Marge learned these songs and stories from her grandma, Jenny John (K'ùkhèla) and her dad Little Jim (Kätänayeàtà), her step dad, Big Jim, and other elders. Marge had to work for these stories by chopping wood and carrying water for elders who told them to children in the evening.

In 2006, Marge made a book called "My Country is Alive: A Southern Tutchone Life" with the help of anthropologist Beth O'Leary. They made this CD to tell about her life and to pass on her culture.

Marge says, "Other people need to do the same way, what I do, because kids need to learn the same way from us. Kids can learn from this book and CD. If we don't do this we are going to lose our stories."

The stories are about Crow and how he creates the world, Äsùya (the smart man) and his encounters with Wolverine, Eagle and Bear. The stories tell about how people survived and how they lived in the environment in the past. The stories are lessons for living today. The songs are all in Dänk'e; they express the love and the connection to the living country.

The CD was produced with Beth O'Leary and Christina Butcher at New Mexico State University with assistance from Yukon Historic Resources Fund, the Yukon Women's Directorate, Yukon Archives and Dona Ana Community College Creative Media.

The CD is dedicated to the many First Nations Elders, both past and present, who have been gracious enough to share their wisdom.
